HOW AND WHEN DOES A PERSON LEARN TO QUILT?

I imagine there are many answers to this question. Some are self-taught, some take a beginning to end beginner class, and others take a one session beginner level class. Some start in grade school, some as young adults, and others start when they retire and have time. Any of these ways can work. My first attempt at quilting was to make a skirt. I cut up a red and blue print dress into squares and added red and blue squares. I thought a quilt was sewing squares together. I have kept that skirt for sentimental reasons, and laugh every time I happen to see it at the bottom of the drawer. It always seems like the more one learns about something the more there is to learn. My stock answer to those switching from garment sewing to quilting is that the main thing to learn is to switch to a ¼" seam allowance. Continual learning is healthy for the brain. I'm forever amazed at how many new inventions there are for making something quicker or easier. It's fun to keep learning.

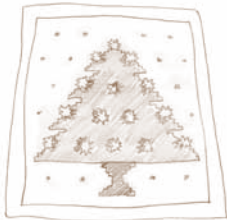

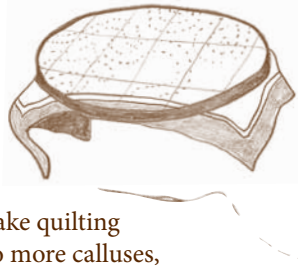
