BEAD EMBROIDERED ORNAMENT (INTERMEDIATE/ADVANCED)

Create an ornate beaded medallion using peyote stitch and a variety of bead embroidery stitches. The medallion includes a Czech glass button and flowers, beautiful Swarovski crystals, and an assortment of richly-colored seed beads. The finished medallion could be made into the focal point of a beaded necklace or hand bag, or it could be completed with the hanging cord provided and made into an ornament for a wall or tree. This class is best suited to students with bead embroidery experience who would like to explore new designs and techniques. Experience with peyote stitch bezels is recommended. 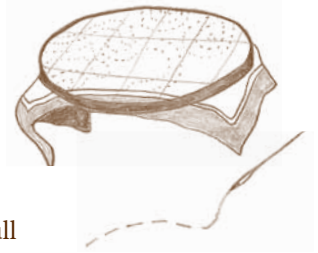

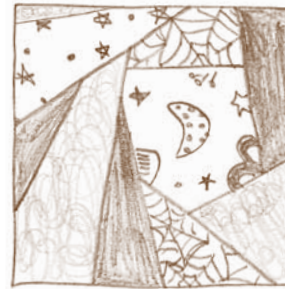
